MEET A CURRENT SCHOLAR

Luxolo Mdolo (2019) is taking a break in his medical studies at the University of Cape Town this year to pursue an honours year in research. He is grateful for the platform that university has provided to be educated academically and through other learning activities—leadership positions, sports, work experiences and making friends.

Outside of class, Luxolo enjoys playing and coaching soccer. He started a football club for kids in his neighborhood during the COVID lockdown that he continues to manage while back at school. Through his YouTube channel and performing live, Luxolo is able to share his love of singing and poetry. Luxolo also serves as a class representative, co-founder of an NGO (Live to Inspire) which provides mentoring to high school students, and as a student wellness representative at UCT working to break the stigma and empower students to care for their mental health.

After graduating from UCT, Luxolo plans to give back to the schools and programs that helped him get to where he is now and develop a soccer academy. Luxolo wants to empower the youth of South Africa, bring back dignity to their homes and plant seeds of unity in the children of South Africa. Being a Gallagher Scholar means everything to Luxolo, providing a family away from home, nurturing a vision in his head and turning his struggles into success stories. It has inspired Luxolo to live to inspire others. Through the experience of being a Gallagher Scholar, he has become motivated to ask, "How can I help? How can I contribute? How can I make a difference in someone's life?". Luxolo says, "Being a Gallagher Scholar has made me willing to do more because I have been given more."

MEET A GRADUATED SCHOLAR İlayda Mutlu

ilayda Mutlu (2010) graduated with majors in Guidance/Psychological Counseling and Preschool Education from Boğaziçi in 2017. While working as a psychological counselor at a teaching institution and as an intern clinical psychologist at a university, she completed her Masters degree. As a Clinical Psychologist in private practice now, ilayda considers therapists to be facilitators to wellness, helping people reach their optimized lives, whatever that means for each individual. Guiding people in this way helps İlayda feel she has an indirect impact on the world.

İlayda believes that Turkey needs young leaders who are open to hearing the voices of others, who can speak about their values without violating others, and are not afraid of defending universal ethical values and who are advocates of human rights for everyone. İlayda's advice for current scholars: "Don't give up on your dream. Life can be tough but acknowledging what you desire helps. If you are experiencing difficulties in your path, express it your own way—write about it, speak about it, paint it, whatever helps you."
